However, only self-sufficient articles will be published, and not news items, book reviews, critical notices, or "discussion notes" (short or long). The journal specializes in papers of a particular sort, those manifesting a strong interaction between contemporary and historical concerns. Either historical material should be exploited to deal with matters on the agenda of current discussion, or present-day concepts, methods, distinctions, arguments, etc., should be used to illuminate historical questions.
